

# James 4:15 For that ye ought to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that.

## Sunday- If It Be The Lord's Will!

**Focus:** Everything that happens is of the Lord's will.

**Teaching Point:** We don't always know what tomorrow will bring, but God does.

**Activity Idea:** Draw pictures of things you want to do, then write "Lord's willing" above it.

## Monday- We Make Plans But God Makes The Final Decision

**Focus:** What does it mean to fully trust in God?

**Teaching point:** Do you ask God before making plans? Let's think of ways we can include Him more.

**Activity Idea:** Create a mini "Plan with God" list — 3 things you'd like to do, and pray over them with your child.

## Tuesday- What Does "If The Lord Will" Mean

**Focus:** We are not in control, but the Lord is.

**Teaching point:** Dive deeper into what "If the Lord will" really means — trusting that God sees what we can't.

**Activity Idea:** Do a "Trust Walk" — blindfold your child and gently lead them around. Talk afterward about how following God is like trusting a guide.

## Wednesday-Living With Purpose

**Focus:** How do we live our life with purpose?

**Teaching point:** Teach your child that every day is a gift from God, and we should live it well — always ready to say "yes" to His plans and keeping his laws.

**Activity Idea:** Make a paper chain with things your child can do for God (ex. pray, read Bible). Add to it each day.

## Thursday- Say It

**Focus:** What does Lord's willing mean?

**Teaching point:** Practice using the words "Lord willing" in everyday speech — help your child understand it's not just a phrase but a reminder.

**Activity Idea:** Play "Plan & Say" — you say a plan ("We'll go to the park"), and they respond, "Lord's willing"

## Friday- Application

**Teaching point:** How can you apply this verse in your life?

**Focus:** God wants us to live our lives wisely and not boast about what is going to happen.

**Scripture Memorization:** Have the child recite the scripture from heart

**Activity Idea:** Draw two paths — one with "My Way," and one with "God's Way" and talk about the difference.
